ABOUT FLICKA FRIENDS

Flicka Friends is a newsletter that is written specifically for the people who own, crew aboard, or are interested in the Flicka, a twenty foot sailing yacht designed by Bruce P. Bingham.

Based on the Newport Boats of Block Island Sound, this little ship has been built from various materials from the 1970's until 2002. This includes Flickas constructed from plans obtained directly from Bruce's California office. About 400 sets of plans were sold. According to Bruce Bingham, many Flickas can be found in New Zealand, Australia, and Sweden.

A number of hulls were built by Nor'Star and some were completed by Westerly Marine. The manufacturer of the bulk of the class is Pacific Seacraft who built 434 hulls in California.

Flicka Friends is published on a quarterly basis: with issues being posted to the internet in March, June, September and December. Articles and photographs are welcome and encouraged.

Flicka Photo Gallery - For Flicka owners that do not want to create an article for the newsletter, a digital photo and a caption describing the scene, the location, what the image shows. Please include your Flickas hull number, name, year, and related owner information.

With enough interest and a steady flow of images, I'd like to expand the Photo Gallery into a separate newsletter for Flicka Friends and publish it on a slightly different quarterly schedule.

This issue is an example of what can be created with twenty to thirty photos. Most of the work was accomplished in three or four days.







She is a work in progress and a number of projects have already been completed. They include:


- Repairing the sails


